A – Brake Cable F – Brake Lever

Assembly

- 1. Remove the walker from its box and unwrap the parts.
- 2. Insert the push handles into the top of the front leg sections
- 3. Line up the holes on the push handles with the holes in the legs at the desired height and insert the bolts supplied.
- 4. Tighten the supplied hand knobs onto the bolts.



5. Insert the backrest into the backrest brackets on the front legs until they lock into place.



Handle Height Adjustment

For proper height adjustment, stand upright with shoulders relaxed and arms at your side. Adjust handle height to the height of the inside of your wrist where your watch strap would be.



Folding

- 1) Lock the brakes on by pushing down both brake levers until they click into place.
- 2) Fold seat up vertically and lift strap attached to folding mechanism.
- Optional: Backrest can be removed at any time by releasing the locking pins and lifting the backrest out of backrest bracket.

Unfolding

To unfold push down on the folding mechanism until the are fully extended.



Operating the Brakes

Always push down on both brake handles to lock the wheels before sitting. CAUTION: The rear wheels will lock but it may still slide if the floor surface is slippery.



Squeeze both brake handles to release the brake (2) CAUTION never release the brakes until you are standing stable and in the ready walk position. Do not release the brakes if you are sitting down.



If you are walking and wish to slow down, squeeze the brake handles slightly to put brake pressure on the wheels.





Over time the brake cables will stretch and require adjustment.

- 1) With the brakes off, grasp the locking nut with a small wrench or pair of pliers, and turn counter clockwise to loosen.
- 2) With fingers, unscrew the adjusting screw to tighten brakes. A turn or two should be enough.
- 3) While holding adjustment screw in place tighten the locking nut.



4) Repeat on brake on other side.

Note: If the brakes are too loose the wheels will turn when the brakes are on. If the cable is too tight the bakes will not lock on.

IMPORTANT: before using the walker, ensure the brakes are working properly. If the wheels turn while the brakes are applied have them adjusted before using the walker.

Safety Information

Consult a physician or other medical professional to determine if this equipment is suitable for your needs.

Ensure all parts are secure, brakes are functional and the frame is fully opened before using.

Always lock the brakes on before siting and leave them locked until you're standing and ready to walk again.

Travel up and down slopes and inclines. DO NOT travel across inclines.

Use caution on slippery surfaces.

Do Not over tighten hardware attaching to the frame. This could cause damage to the frame tubing or strip the threads.

Do Not stand on seat.

Do Not overload this rollator. The weight capacity is 264 pounds (220 lb for Model CH3031) including the user and any things they may be carrying.

Inspection Items

Ensure rollator rolls straight (no excessive drag or pull to one side). Inspect the seat for tears and/or excessive sagging. Inspect hand grips for wear, looseness or damage. Inspect for any loose or broken hardware or parts. Inspect for cracked, broken or loose wheels.

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
